FIRST ORSP-NEC OR COURSE HELD

The ORSP, in a joint effort with the UP National Engineering Center (NEC), successfully held its first course on "Quantitative and Computer-Based Techniques for Manufacturing and Distribution" last September 6 to 8. Held at the NEC Building in UP, the three-day course was attended by some 61 managers, technical analysts, and academicians from over 15 companies and universities.

The seminar covered a comprehensive range of techniques and software for effective decision-making in manufacturing and distribution. Topics included methods and applications in traditional fields like Forecasting, Facilities Planning, Production Planning, Inventory Control, and Distribution Management, as well

as recent technological tools such as Geographic Information Systems and the Internet.

NEC Director Dr. Rey Vea, himself an ORSP member, formally opened the seminar, while ORSP President Dr. Jun Villoria gave the closing remarks and awarded certificates of completion to the participants.

ORSP Special Lecture, Gen. Assembly, and Fellowship Night

The ORSP held 3 special events on Dec.2 at the National Engineering Center Bldg. The first of these was a special lecture entitled "A Survey of Large-scale Optimization Techniques and Applications," given by Dr. Alexander Hipolito of the UP Mathematics Department. Dr. Hipolito is one of ORSP's newest members, having just recently concluded his postdoctoral research at the TUDelft (Netherlands). The lecture was attended by some 20 participants from industry and the academe.

The second event, a special general membership meeting, immediately followed the lecture. ORSP Vice Pres. Dr. Elvie Zamora discussed preparations for ORSP's hosting of the 1997 International Conference on OR/MS in Manila. Also taken up was the election of new Board Members to fill the position vacated by Dr. Mel Acebedo and the one which will soon be left by ORSP Pres. Dr. Jun Villoria. Dr. Acebedo is currently on a research program in Macau, while Dr. Villoria leaves in February 1996 to do research in the US under the Fullbright Program. With only a few members present at the meeting, it was decided that the election be done by mail.

The third and concluding event was ORSP's Christmas Get Together which was attended by about 24 regular and student members.

The IFORS Prize for OR in Development

The International Federation of OR Societies (IFORS) is inviting all OR academicians and practitioners to submit entries to the 1996 IFORS Prize for OR in Development. This competition, which has become a traditional and important IFORS activity, will be a highlight in next year's IFORS Triennial Conference in Vancouver, Canada. The prize will be awarded at the close of the conference.

The Prize Committee, chaired by Elise del Rosario, ORSP's representative to IFORS, welcomes all papers meeting the following criteria:

- The paper should describe a practical OR application in a developing country, conducted to assist an organization in its decision-making process, and with original features in methodology or implementation.
- The principal authors should be nationals of a developing country.
- The write-up should be publishable in the International Transactions in Operations Research (ITOR) with at most minor revisions.
- The paper should include some description of the application's social context and its impact on the organization

The ORSP on Student Affairs

One of the ORSP's thrusts is that of generating interest in OR/MS among the students, whose ranks hold the future practitioners, enthusiasts, and leaders in the field. It was in line with this that the Society moved for the formation of student chapters in different academic institutions. The ORSP envisions its student members to be the epitome of energetic and promising youth through whose enthusiasm an early awareness and appreciation for OR could be effected and shared.

To date, the Society has six (6) recognized student chapters with a total membership of about 900. The six chapters are based in the following institutions: Adamson University, Ateneo de Manila University, De La Salle University, Holy Angel University (Angeles City), Mapua Institute of Technology, and the University of Santo Tomas. The Society is presently assisting four other universities in forming their respective student chapters.

In line with its student affairs program, our ORSP has thus far held five OR Quiz Shows and Paper Writing Contests. In August 1994, the Society initiated the formation of the Federation of ORSP Student Chapters with a threefold aim: (1) to solicit the active participation of students in the promotion of the discipline and of the programs of the Society, (2) to foster camaraderie and a closer working relationship among the students of ORSP-affiliated schools, and (3) to assist the Society in planning and implementing student-related programs.

At present, the Society is tapping the Federation for assistance in forthcoming activities. These are the 6th OR Quiz Show and Paper Writing Contest, and the First Student Congress on OR/MS, which are both planned for February 1996.

The Board of Directors believes that with the Student Federation, student involvement in the Society's programs would be stronger. We look forward to many more worthy projects with the Federation.
