ORSP Past President Dennis Beng Hui, Incoming President JC Mercado, Director Wilson Wy Tiu and ORSP-Corps Chair, Ms. Elise del Rosario paid a courtesy visit to the Secretary of Department of Science and Technology, Dr. Estrella F. Alabastro last June 4, 2001 at the DOST office in Bicutan, Taguig, Metro Manila.

During the meeting, Secretary Alabastro agreed to endorse ORSP to PCASTRD head, Dra. Ida Dalmacio, so that the society can initiate some programs with DOST. Wilson Wy Tiu broached the idea of adopting Operations Research as an area in advanced science. Secretary Alabastro offered the alternative of considering

Secretary Alabastro mentioned the Science and Technology Information Institute (STII) of DOST as a potential participating unit for the ORSP KAPIHAN Series. Possible DOST sponsorship for a nationwide OR Student Congress, Student OR Paper Writing Contest and Annual OR quiz were also discussed.

While ORSP reiterated its support to the projects of DOST, Dr. Alabastro expressed optimism about the role ORSP can play in the national IT issues which DOST spearheads.

ORSP General Meet Focuses on Supply Chain

The Peninsula Manila was the venue of the highly-successful ORSP General Assembly held last May 4, 2001 at 6:30 in the evening.

Gracing the affair are two of the country's well-known experts in Supply Chain. Jaime G. del Rosario, President of Accenture Philippines and Dr. Alexander Hipolito, Senior SCM Consultant, HP Consulting (Singapore).


Jaime G. del Rosario highlighted the emerging trend of collaborative materials management between suppliers, marketer manufacturers and retailers. He contrasted this with the previously adversarial relationship between the two. Highlighting the importance of OR and IT in this new set up, del Rosario showed how OR and IT are harnessed to facilitate the flow of information for orders, replenishment, and delivery of materials to the point of distribution from anywhere in the world at the time when the distributors/ retailers need them. Entitled

"Supply Chain, Collaborative Forecasting, Planning and Replenishment", the speech pinpointed that while the mathematical methods of OR can help tame forecast errors, variabilities in lead time, stock outs and manufacturing spikes and valleys, the collaboration approach makes the application of OR methods even more effective in improving system cycle times and materials availability.

Alexander Hipolito's presentation on "OR in E-Business-Focus on Supply Chain Management and Optimization" gave an overview of supply chain optimization (SCO) systems also known as Advanced Planning and Scheduling (APS). The main objective was to provide an understanding of models and techniques behind SCO systems like i2 Rhythm, SAP APO, Oracle and APS. The presentation showed how SCO systems are heavily based on operations research advances. techniques, and methodologies in optimizing and coordinating the use of limited resources, improving on-time delivery and service levels while reducing costs and inventories. The presentation concluded with a discussion on lessons learned from the speaker's SCO implementation experiences in semiconductor and high tech electronics industries. (CONT on p7)

IFORS Visits 43rd Annual Conference of Canadian OR Society

The new administration of the International Federation of OR Societies (IFORS) held its first meeting in Quebec City from May 6-9 this year. ORSP's own Corps Chair Elise del Rosario attended the meeting in her capacity as IFORS Vice President.

Featured in the conference were plenary sessions on Operations Research in Support of Army Strategic Management, Statistical Regularity and OR, Robustness Analysis and Sensitivity Analysis, and the Practice of OR in the Canadian Department of National Defense. Also featured in the conference were tutorials on Preference Function Modeling-Theory, Mathematical Programming II-Using the MPL Modeling Systems and the Optimax 2000 Component Library to

Create Embedded Optimization Applications, Multi-agent Systems and Global Optimization Software and Applications. Elise del Rosario chaired the IFORS entry to the conference, the "OR/MS Tutorials on the www: An Overview of the IFORS Tutorial Project" presented by Prof. Moshe Sniedovich of the University of Melbourne.

With the theme "Decision Aid for Performance Enhancement," the conference featured 178 papers—majority of which highlighted army, airline, public transport, e-commerce and communication network applications. Theory of multi-objective optimization, network and transportation, algorithms and decision support systems were widely tackled. The conference was conducted in

English and French.

The IFORS Administrative Committee participated in the Ceremonies which involved awarding of prizes to several competitions supported by the Canadian OR Society. In its meetings, IFORS gave due importance to activities affecting the promotion of OR among practitioners, the academe and students throughout the world.

Exorcising the Mysteries of Mathematical Programming

A year after its highly-successful overview seminar on OR entitled "Enhancing Profitability through Operations Research" the ORSP Board has responded to the request of those who attended the seminar as well as of other members. This November, ORSP will offer a training for those who wish to solve OR problems themselves.

What better way to start than to tackle the most frequently-used OR tool-Mathematical Programmingthrough the most-frequently-used software-Microsoft Excel?

Exorcising the Mysteries of Mathematical Programming is a case study-based workshop that will equip participants with knowledge on for-

mulating linear and integer programming problems and solving them using the Excel Solver and Xpress MP. By the end of the workshop, participants should be able to formulate problems and derive solutions for them. Each participant is assured of sharing one computer with at most only one other participant.

The workshop will be handled by ORSP Board members led by Prof. Dennis Beng Hui of the De La Salle University. Make your reservations early. There are limited slots available.

The student version of express MP will be distributed free to the participants.

Adviser name must be included. An adviser can coach more than one contestant. Entries must not have been previously published.

Written presentation refers to clarity of written material. Oral presentation is applicable to the five finalist papers.

What are the requirements?

For the selected five finalist papers, at least one author must personally present the paper for at most 30 minutes during the Student Congress on February, 2002. Testimonials from beneficiaries of the project are allowed in this presentation. Awards will be given at the Closing Ceremonies of the Congress.

When is the deadline?

Three (3) copies of the paper must be received at the ORSP office or by any of its Board members and representatives no later than December 15, 2001.

Mailed entries must be post marked no later than December 15, 2001.
